In terms of Section 38(8) of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999)

Trans Hex Heavy Minerals Mining (Pty) Ltd is applying for a multi-commodity prospecting right in terms of the Mineral and Petroleum Resource Development Act 28 of 2002 (MPRDA) in off the Kwa-Zulu Natal (KZN) coast (offshore of Richards Bay), South Africa. The prospecting will occur in a 70500 ha area known as the prospecting precinct, and extends from approximately 21 km south of Richards Bay to 44 km northeast of Richards Bay. Occurring from 5km off the coast in the north and 31km off the coast in the south.

SRK Consulting (South Africa) (Pty) Ltd (SRK) has been appointed by Trans Hex Heavy Minerals Mining to undertake the Scoping & Environmental Impact Report (S&EIR). The EIA process is being undertaken in accordance with the EIA Regulations, 2014, and will inform the application for EA in terms of National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (NEMA) and the Mining Right Application in terms of the MPRDA.

The application is for prospecting of gemstones, precious metals, industrial minerals, Ferrous and Non-ferrous metals. The proposed prospecting activities will include geophysical surveys, drill sampling and the deployment of seabed crawlers to systematically recover and process diamond-bearing sediments.

The draft Scoping Report (dSR) has been submitted to SAHRA for comment. It is noted that the dSR states that a Marine Heritage Specialist Study will be undertaken as part of the EIA phase. As part of the study, a Marine Heritage Impact Assessment and Palaeontological Impact Assessment will be complied into a Heritage Impact Assessment report.


